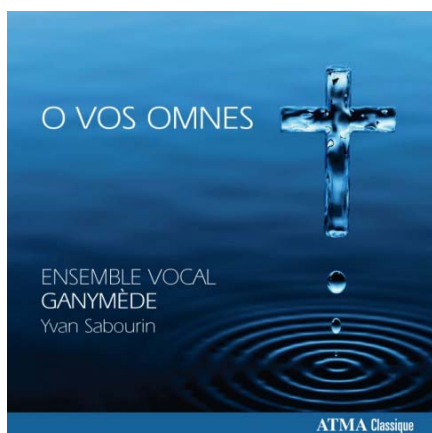

O vos Omnes

Sacred and secular choral music

Ensemble vocal Ganymède (Male Choir)

Yvan Sabourin, conductor

To mark the 20th anniversary of the Montreal-based vocal ensemble, **Ganymède**, ATMA presents *O vos Omnes*, a CD of sacred and secular *cappella* works for male choir.

Musical selections on this recording range from the Renaissance era through to modern times and include works by Victoria, Schubert, Lauridsen, and Brian Schmidt among others. Included in the selections on this recording is *Quand vous mourrez de nos amours*, a song by Gilles Vigneault in an arrangement by the choir's founder, **Yvan Sabourin**.

The Ganymède vocal ensemble was founded in 1991 by Sabourin, who is its current artistic director. This ensemble has its roots in Montreal's gay community, and its mission is to perform the classic repertoire for male choir with the goal of making this music better known. The CD takes its title from the piece *O Vos Omnes*, composed in 1932 by the internationally renowned cellist, conductor and composer, Pablo Casals.

Over its 20-year history, Ganymède has established an excellent reputation throughout the musical world, with high-profile concerts and appearances in several competitions including the Montreal Choir Festival, where the choir won a special jury prize in 1994 and took first prize in 1995 and 1997 in the advanced choirs category; the Festival international du chant choral of Trois-Rivières, where they were finalists in 1997 and were selected as the invited choir in 1998; and have appeared at the National Music Festival and Podium, the annual event held by the Association of Canadian Choral Communities.

In the summer of 2006, Ganymède won the gold medal at the Choral Festival of the World Outgames. The following summer, the ensemble travelled to France to give concerts in Paris, Lyon, and Vaison-la-Romaine. In the summer of 2010, Ganymède was honored at the competition of the Festival choral international of Neuchâtel in Switzerland, winning a special diversity prize in recognition of its minority-integration efforts.

O vos omnes will be available from April 26, 2011.
